LECTURE

MANAGEMENT OF OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH AND MEDICAL SUPPORT WORLDWIDE

➤ ABSTRACT

There is a growing emphasis on the responsibility and accountability of company management for the safe guarding of health and safety of employees as well as for the community at large. This is reflected in increasing regulatory controls, employee and public interest, and a recognition that good occupational health standards benefit industry and its employees. As a consequence, all the major Oil and Gas Companies have developed and issued policy statements on health, safety and environmental conservation.

In order to assist Eni E&P Division Subsidiaries and Affiliated Companies to address Occupational Health and Medical Support matters in a systematic and practical manner, Eni E&P Division has accepted the use of the HSE QR Integrated Management System (HSE QR IMS) as the basis for the implementation of health into its operational activities.

The key HSE QR IMS elements are: Policy, Planning, Implementation, Monitoring, Review.

The lecture will be focused in the "Health Management System" (HMS) developed as integrated element of the HSE QR IMS and the way how Occupational Health can be managed similar to safety and other aspects of the business.

➤ BIOGRAPHY

After graduating, Angelo Madera moved in 1985 to Tanzania, as Head of Health Services within a consortium of Italian companies (GSLE, Sadelmi, Sarplast) for civil engineering constructions. In 1987 he returned to Rome where he completed the specialization in Infectious Diseases. In August 1988 he moved to Iran with Saipem (Eni) where he served as Industrial Doctor within a Pipeline Construction Project. Back in Italy in 1989 he worked as Medical Adviser in Tropical Diseases at the Center for the Study of Tropical Diseases (Centro Studi di Medicina Tropicale, CESMET) in Rome. From 1990 to March 1997, within Eni, he went to Libya, initially as Industrial Doctor on the offshore platforms at the Bouri field and later as Deputy Medical Superintendent in the main clinics in Tripoli. During the period 1997 – January 1999 he served as Head of Health Services for Agip Recherches Congo and participated in the management of the emergency situation due the Civil War; he later contributed to the transformation of Agip's Clinic at Point Noir to a national focal point for infectious diseases. At present he covers the position of International Medical Service Manager (SMES) within Eni E&P Division. Angelo Madera authored more than 30 publications and is University Lecturer at the Occupational Health Department of the Tor Vergata University in Rome.
